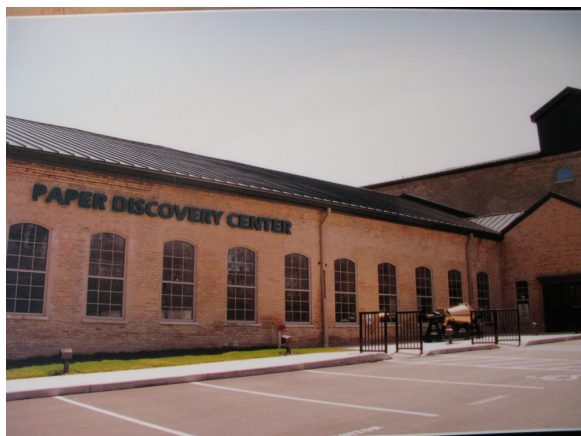

The Paper Discovery Center is located in the historic Atlas Paper Mill overlooking the scenic Fox River in Appleton, Wisconsin.

Since opening in 2005, more than 21,000 visitors have explored the world of paper through hands-on activities, learning how paper is made today, and making some paper of their own to take home!

Now, the Paper Discovery Center is offering a chance for paper industry workers, past and present, to become a part of its **Paper Legacy Foundation Wall**. Interested parties can sponsor a cast bronze "brick" nameplate to commemorate their legacy.

The Paper Legacy Foundation Wall is located on the River Level of the Paper Discovery Center. The wall's brick arches, built in 1878, provided foundational support for three paper machines that operated for many decades on the main floor above. These bronze bricks will be mounted onto the original brickwork.

Paper Legacy Foundation Wall Details:

Eligibility

Any individual who works or has worked in the paper industry or a related field can be recognized with a cast bronze brick.

Recognition Location

The cast bronze bricks will be mounted onto the original brickwork of the River Level supporting arches within the Paper Discovery Center.

Donation

\$1,000 is requested. This contribution is fully tax deductible in accordance with the 501(c)3 non-profit status of the Paper Discovery Center and can be fulfilled in one payment or four annual payments.

Recognition Nameplate

The 2 by 8 inch cast bronze brick nameplates will contain three lines of information about the individual and his or her career.

Biographical Directory

A directory near the wall will contain an additional page of biographical or anecdotal information about each recognized individual.
