If submitted electronically, the cover sheet with the original signatures of the two nominating sponsors must be mailed to the office. Nominations will not be considered complete until original signatures from the nominators have been received.

Nominations that have been received within the past four years remain eligible for selection; however, it is essential that all information contained in the applications be updated. Names and addresses of the candidate and the sponsors need to be current. **Please review your copy if you have submitted a nomination and send us corrected addresses as necessary.**

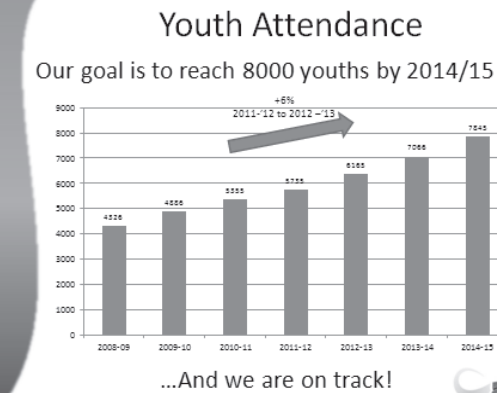

Celebrating the Wonder of Paper with STEM

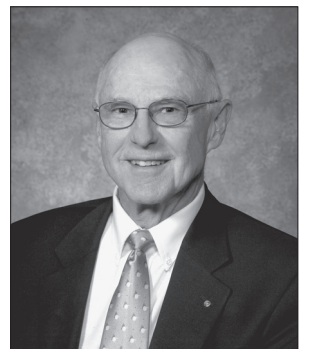
We are entering our 10th year here at the Paper Discovery Center and our reputation as a dynamic center of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) based learning experiences is growing. Our goal is to touch the lives of 9,000 children/year by the end of 2015, and we are right on track. In 2013, we brought a STEM learning experience to 6,000 youth. We saw growth in our Scout programs and our Summer Science Series attendance. While schools in general are taking fewer class field trips, our field trip attendance has remained steady. Our educators have reworked our field trip offerings to accommodate larger groups of students per visit and more closely match the curriculum being taught in the classroom. Kids enjoy the interactive and memorable experience they have at the Paper Discovery Center; teachers like the quality of programming and customization we offer for class visits. We have become a popular destination for informal learning for Fox Valley youth.



Kids have fun at the PDC, and leave hungry for more science, technology, engineering and math. Educators Linda Werner and Amber Hamilton are coordinating our educational programs, while our new staff educators Karla Berg and Sharon Clothier bring new talents to the team in Volunteer management and Exhibit production along with their teaching skills. We are starting 2014 with a great team, fresh ideas and new educational offerings.
